

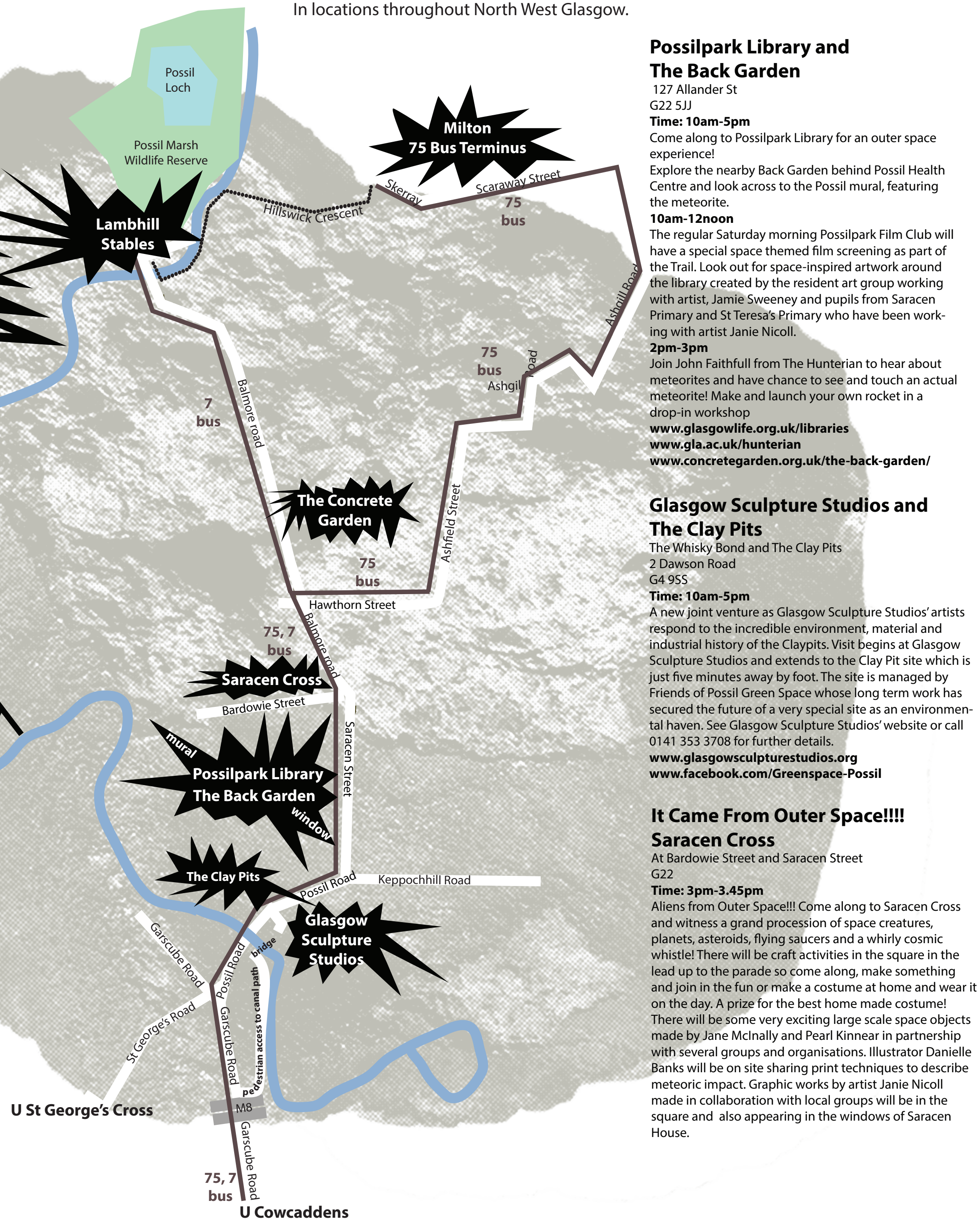
The Trail of The Possil Meteorite

April 1st 2017 from 10am to 8pm
In locations throughout North West Glasgow.

Inspired by a unique cosmic event: the landing of a meteorite in the North of Glasgow, which took place on Thursday, 5 April 1804. One of only four such objects ever found in Scotland, the stony meteorite marks Possil and Lambhill as special places within a global directory of meteorite landings. Our place in Outer Space! Explored in art, talks, film, performance, procession, cloth, wind, and animation. The focus of the trail is on collaboration and connections. Follow the full trail or drop in to events. Buses 7 and 75 pass locations and a small ferry will operate on the canal between The Whisky Bond and Lambhill.

Two artists Douglas Laing and Jemima Dansey-Wright are working with groups and local residents to produce two site specific artworks.

Douglas is exploring the history and realisation of The Aeolian Harp and will make instruments for both this site and Lambhill Stables. The Aeolian Harp works through the reverberation of wind on strings and is determined by the weather on the day.

Through group working sessions, Jemima will be printing swathes of flag material to claim different sectors of space. This fabric will be used to make soft furnishings for local residents in the week after the trail.
